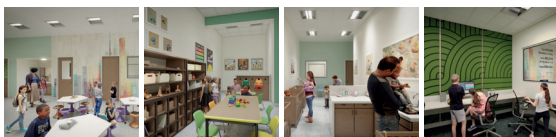

Solid Foundations

Children experiencing homelessness are more likely to have slowed development, learning disabilities, low self-esteem, and limited social skills than children who are not experiencing homelessness.

At the Center for Women and Families, our goal is to combat these realities with care. Our on-site, fully accredited preschool and youth programs allow children to continue to learn and grow despite living in the crisis of homelessness, while their parents focus on working, saving money, looking for work, or taking classes to build a future of stability.

Strong Building Blocks



The new building will allow us to serve 40-50% more youth through providing what they need to grow and thrive.

Infants will experience warm nursery care. Young children will have quality early childhood education and a safe space to play. More youth will have access to homework help, tutoring, enrichment programs, and mentorship, as well as a brand-new technology lab and multimedia creative studio.

These spaces will increase opportunities to learn, explore different outlets for creativity, and excel in school and social settings.

Lasting Impact



Helping families find stability after hardship is critical, especially for children who can experience the effects of homelessness for a lifetime. Rosemary fought for a stability for her son that they could no longer find at home, and thanks to the Coalition, they found safety and support that would allow their family to grow and thrive.
